

The information below shows government performance for the assessment of complex mining assessments for completed stages from 1 November 2014 to 31 December 2015. The complex mining projects are those referred to the PAC for both review and determination. In 2014 it had been identified that this type of project was taking over 1,000 days to determine including time in government hands of 688 days (previous average days per stage of assessment shown at A).

The target was to reduce time in government hands to 402 days. The Government achieved better than the target and achieved actual average days at the end of December 2015 of 357 days. (Lines B and C).

This represents savings of 331 days compared with the long term targeted savings of 286. The 2015 component of the target was 170 days.
